## WHAT IS THE MICKLEGATE STRAYS TRUST?

If you are a Freemen of the City of York and living in the area of the Micklegate Stray (the area west of the River Ouse but within the boundary of the City of York as shown on the map below – area shaded yellow), you will be aware that in 1907 Micklegate Stray passed into the hands of the City of York Council by means of the Micklegate Stray Act.

Part of this Act included the establishing of a Trust to benefit the Freemen and their dependants and a special scheme was set up by the Charities Commission, which has over the years helped benefit Freemen and their families with a financial contribution or assistance with enhanced development opportunities.

The purpose of this is to make Freemen aware of the provisions of the Trust and ask whether there is any assistance that can be given to them or their families, subject to completion of an application and agreement of the Trustees. Additionally, should you know of Freemen who are not members of the Gild of Freemen but who do reside in the area of the Micklegate Stray, it would be appreciated if you could make them aware of the provisions of the Trust.
